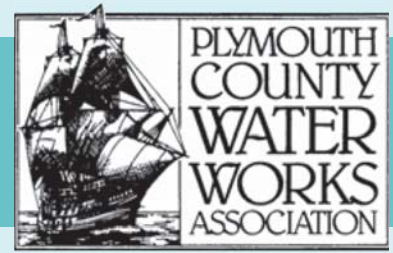

The presence of Pharmaceuticals and Personal Care Products (PPCPs) in the environment has recently received increasing attention in both the popular and scientific press. Current wastewater and drinking water treatment systems are not designed to efficiently remove these inherently water-soluble environmental pollutants. Treatment practices must be altered to reflect this new challenge. This course will present the driver and barriers to reduce the environmental load of PPCPs to the environment through the application of Green Pharmacy.
